## REHEARSED/TABLE READING | 'TOO OLD FOR THIS SH\*T\* | 2.20pm A screenplay by Paddy Francis

Actor/director Chris Anderson (appearing in 'Doctor Who', 'Silent Witness', 'Eastenders' – to name a few) leads a cast of actors in a rehearsed/table reading of a 40minute section from Paddy Francis' new screenplay, 'Too Old For This Sh\*t'.

'There's no 'getting out'... even if you're Well þast it'.



Over-the-hill getaway driver, PAYTON MURPHY, passes out during a bank robbery. ROR (Payton's nephew) gets nicked as their gang barely get away with Payton in tow, and their all-important 'swag'. To save his skin, Ror rats on all involved, apart from his beloved uncle. All swag is seized; most are arrested. Yet, the mob are convinced Payton still has his share 'squirreled away, somewhere'; and, everyone wants their piece.

'Too Old For This Sh\*t' is a wickedly witty, British gangster, black comedy that playfully jabs at the foibles, hypocrisies and convictions of the boomer generation – particularly the rightwinged, working class criminal. Imagine if the McDonagh brothers (Martin and John Michael) co-wrote a low-budget, satirical, almost facetious version of 'Sexy Beast', set in the backwaters of Essex instead of the alluring coast of Almeria.

## SCENE DESIGN PRESENTATION | 3.20pm



## 'BREAKING THE INDUSTRY' - TALK & Q&A | MARN DAVIES | 4.15pm

Chris Anderson hosts a 20-minute talk with the wonderfully warm, down-to-earth and straight-talking, Marn Davies, about 'Breaking the Industry' as a screenwriter and filmmaker. A 10-minute Q&A, involving the audience, concludes this talk.



Marn Davies is known for his work as a Writer on the feature films 'The Gentlemen', 'Wrath of Man', 'Operation Fortune: Ruse de guerre', and 'The Covenant', as well as being an Executive Producer on 'The Gentlemen' TV series.

Since 2001, Marn has worked as a Writer, Director, Producer, Editor, and Camera Person across Film and TV. Marn received his first TV directing credit for 'The National 5-a-side Championships' for Sky Sports in 2001 and in 2005 co-directed the BBC One 'Live 8' documentaries. He has edited promos for Hollywood movies including 'Sherlock Holmes' and 'Unknown'.
